



All-day care

All-day care? Pupils from year 5-7 have to conduct the online registration and hand in a confirmation form?

Concerning clubs, it is possible that a pupil would like to join the Football Club which takes place on Mondays in the 9th lesson. Since the pupil's last lesson that day is the 6th, he or she goes home, might have lunch, and returns to school again at 2.50 pm (beginning of the 9th lesson). That is the normal thing to do and many pupils will do the same when they want to join a club in the afternoon. In this case, the pupil joins a club without making use of *the all-day care*.

All-day care means that the KRS does not merely provide activities in the afternoon but that parents can enrol their children on the all-day care, which takes place on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays (parents can choose freely between those days). The school, then, makes sure that those children are supervised until the 9th lesson. If parents choose that service, their children are not allowed to leave the school premises during the 7th lesson. Moreover, the child must choose clubs which take place in the 8th and 9th lesson.

All-day care is optional. If children are not enrolled on the all-day care, they can, nevertheless, have lunch and take part in homework supervision and clubs.

For legal reasons, every pupil of year 5-7 must conduct the online enrolment and thereby decide whether to choose the all-day care or not. That online enrolment is also necessary for those, who do not enrol on a club. Why? In the enrolment process, parents are also asked whether they would like to make use of the all-day care *or not*.

After the online enrolment, a **confirmation form** must be printed out and signed. The class teachers collect those forms at school.
